## Principal's news

Term 1 has been full of many highlights, including our 2023 Welcome Night, Aquatics, Student Leaders Induction, School Captains visit to Parliament House, Athletics Carnivals, Choir Assessment, Parent Teacher Interviews, the implementation of our Reading Stars, Dr Sarah Gray's visit and the 2023 Ardrossan Art display. These events have occurred together with, and have strengthened, the learning which occurs in our classes daily.

The Year 7-12 reports will be forwarded home on Thursday. The reports highlight student progress across the term and overall academic achievement towards the year level Achievement Standards, though the A-E grades. We have had a very strong start to the year, and this is reflected in the progress comments in the reports and grades which students have achieved. Our 2023 Site Improvement Plan (SIP) goal is to increase the number of A and B grades, through the implementation of high impact teaching strategies. Our term 1 results indicate that we are tracking well towards this goal. I encourage all students and parents/carers to make contact with teachers if there are any questions or concerns regarding the reports.

Last week we were very privileged to have past AAS student, Dr Sarah Gray speak to our Year 6-12 cohort. Sarah spoke about her medical journey, her current credentials as an Orthopedic Registrar and her career aspirations of becoming an Orthopedic Oncological Surgeon. Her key messages to students were to be yourself, work hard and to reach for the stars. I have had conversations with many students over the past week about Sarah's inspirational talk and how her message builds on our beginning of the year messaging of creating and making the most of opportunities. We thank Sarah for taking the time out of her busy schedule to visit and we look forward to her visiting again in the future.

## Deputy Principal

Term 1 has been a busy term, with great learning happening across classrooms as well as a variety of additional opportunities occurring for our students to extend and apply their thinking in some new and exciting contexts.

Adelaide University visited AAS in week 8 to work with our Year 10 to Year 12 students regarding tertiary and vocational career planning and to present university options. Our Year 10 students completed the Careers Workshop that is designed to help students find their most suitable career pathway, while learning about jobs of the future. The Year 11/12 Presentation covered information about degrees across a variety of faculties at the university, as well as alternative entry pathways, and the support services, facilities, activities that students can access if they decide to pursue a tertiary pathway.

Starting in week 9 female students from Year 9 to 12, were invited to attend the STEM Girls Academy – Creative Challenge a three-day immersive workshop hosted by UniSA at their Mawson Lakes Campus. This collaborative opportunity has been developed by the university to provide students and environment to practice and refine their creativity, in a STEM context. Students work to solve real-world problems posed by the university's industry partners including BAE Systems, who provide some of the world's most advanced, technology-led defence, aerospace and security solutions. The challenge also provides our students the exciting opportunity to meet like-minded girls, to develop their understanding of specific STEM topics. Through their involvement students will also work to enhance their critical thinking and improve their communication skills by working with students from other schools and year levels, skills which closely align with our school vision and values. Students have been supported in this program by Miss Molly Hunter, and attended their first session in week 9. They are attending the second session today and their final day is in Term 2. We look forward to hearing more from the 13 students involved, as well as Miss Hunter, about their learning as they progress through the challenge.

In week 10 students from Year 6 to Year 12 were fortunate to hear from former AAS student, Dr Sarah Gray about her journey in the medical profession, and her current credentials as an Orthopaedic Registrar. They also heard about the current, extensive process she is undertaking to become an Orthopaedic Oncological Surgeon. Students were interested to hear from Dr Sarah about what a 'typical day' in her profession entails, the further study she has undertaken to be on a surgery track and many appreciated the opportunity to participate in the practical suturing activity that she organised. We are very thankful that Dr Sarah was able to take time from her busy schedule to share her wealth of knowledge and experience with our students.

In addition to the above opportunities that have already occurred we have more coming up. In May, students from Year 9 to 12 will have the opportunity to attend South Australia's largest employment expo at the Wayville Showgrounds where they will have the opportunity to engage in information and interactive sessions hosted by a variety of employers and industry sectors.

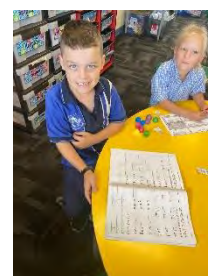
### Primary News

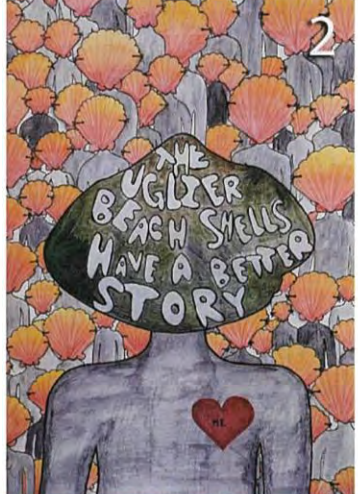

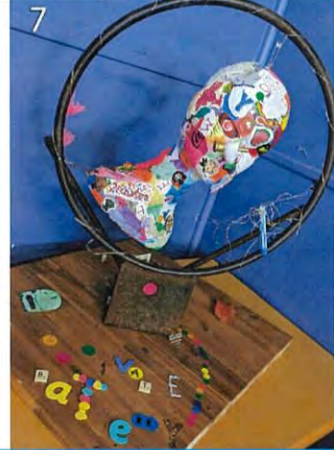

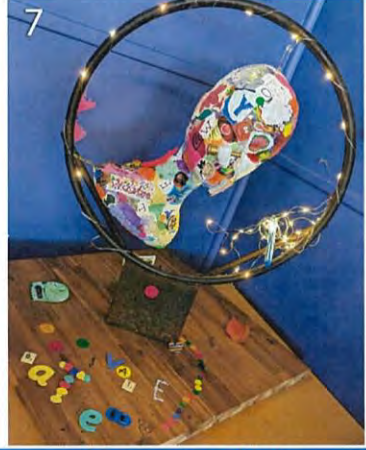

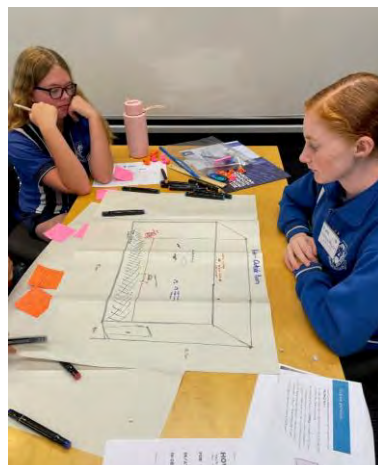
The 24-day Roadshow will visit a number of schools, community football clubs and towns impacted by recent flooding, including Murray Bridge, Barmera and Waikerie.

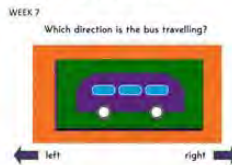
We have reached Week 11.


