### **Principal's news**

**Social Ventures Australia** - Over the last three years I have been fortunate to be involved with Social Ventures Australia (SVA) as part of the SA Regional, Rural and Remote Education Hub. The opportunity to connect and learn from educators and a wide variety of groups and researchers from across SA, NSW and Victoria is something for which I am very grateful.

Last week I attended the SVA Thought Leadership Gathering (TLG) in Sydney and was privileged to hear about the work of Professor Sharon Goldfeld from the Murdoch Children's Research Institute. Prof Goldfeld's work focuses on health and wellbeing and closing the inequity gap. The second speaker was Dr Paul Prichard, Leader of the Training and Development Team at the Centre for Child Health at the Royal Children's Hospital. His presentation was around relationships and how we connect and partner with families and services. During the three days I also visited Rooty Hill High School and had the opportunity to speak to their Leadership Team about their school focus on capabilities, in particular critical and creative thinking, through their Creativity Wheel. Both the presentations at the TLG and the school visit strongly support the work which we are undertaking at AAS.

Lumination learning Lab – Thank you to Tom Van Schaik and his team who have nearly completed the building work on the new Learning Lab. This week the Lumination Team have commenced the installation of the tech equipment. This space is looking amazing and will be an invaluable tool to support and enhance our teaching and learning programs. Staff will be undertaking professional learning, commencing with the staff who have nominated to be our Lab Champions. We look forward to inviting our school community to our Lab Launch towards the end of this term, date to be confirmed.

**Thank you** to everyone who assisted with the yard clean-up over the last few weeks. Your support is greatly appreciated.


