Congratulations to all of the committee, we are very grateful for your support. On behalf of Governing Council, I would also like to thank outgoing representative Hailey Channon for her work across the last few years.

The **2023 AAS Annual Report** was presented at the AGM. This report will be available on the school website soon.

The **Site Improvement Plan** (SIP) for 2024 was also presented at the AGM. We have made significant changes to our SIP, to support the Department's Strategy for Public Education. Based on our work over the last five years focusing on Inquiry learning, and our school vision, developing capabilities for the future, our goal in 2024 is to *Develop effective learners through a focus on capabilities for the future*. I was very proud to be asked to share our Improvement journey with the Kadina Portfolio school site leaders at the Portfolio Day in Week 3. I am also very proud to have been selected as one of the site leaders to share our improvement work at the Education Leaders' Day which will be held on Monday in Adelaide.

Staff will be working on our SIP actions on our **Student Free Day on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March**. This day will include the next professional learning session in our Lumination Learning Lab. The Lab Champs will complete their XR Creation Professional Development and work with our Learning Designer to continue their curriculum planning.

#### **Policy updates**

Governing Council have endorsed a revised AAS Assessment and Reporting Policy. This policy will be available on our website or by contacting the Front Office.

#### **NAPLAN**

NAPLAN for students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 will commence on Wednesday the 13<sup>th</sup> of March and will conclude on Monday the 25<sup>th</sup> of March. Across this testing block students will undertake the four required assessments: Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy. All of these assessments will be completed in the online NAPLAN environment, apart from the Year 3 Writing test – which is handwritten. If you have any questions regarding NAPLAN, please contact feel free to contact Amy East or me to discuss.

#### Smoke-free and vape-free areas – new regulations for schools

From 1 March 2024 new regulations will extend the smoke-free and vape-free areas to within 10 metres of site boundaries.

- This includes
  - School drop off and pick-up zones that are within 10 metres of the school fence, gate or boundary
  - School ovals and sporting fields and within 10 metres of the boundary of the oval or sporting field
  - Footpaths, roads, public nature strips and public recreation areas that are within 10 metres of a school boundary

### Be A M.A.T.E. and Make Allergy Treatment Easier

Having a food allergy can impact on a child's participation in school and other activities. With support, understanding, and education of children, parents/carers, and the wider school community, everyone can include children with food allergy and help to keep them safe.



# Anyone can Be A M.A.T.E. by following these five easy steps:

#### Always take food allergies seriously

It may be hard to believe food that most of us eat and enjoy every day can be harmful to others, but people who have food allergy can have serious allergic reactions (anaphylaxis), which can be life threatening.

#### Don't share food with mates who have food allergy

Everyone loves to share or swap food with each other. But for those with food allergies this can be very dangerous. At school we ask that students do not share their food. Even if you think the food is safe, it's still not worth taking the risk.

#### Always wash hands after eating

Always wash your hands after eating something another student is allergic to. This will help keep them safe.

#### Know what your mates are allergic to

Ask your mates what food they are allergic to. Consider your mates with food allergy when eating your food and try not to be messy. For school birthday parties and celebrations consider non-food treats and activities like stamps and stickers.

#### Get help straight away if a mate gets sick (even if they don't want you to)

If a mate who has food or insect allergies is showing these signs tell them to stay where they are and get a teacher or person in charge straight away:

- Finding it hard to breathe
- Skin that is bumpy, red, and itchy
- Swelling of the face, lips, and eyes
- Vomiting
- Looking pale and feeling dizzy

It has been a busy start to the year for our Student Leadership Group.








The Scholastic Book Fair will be back again this year—arriving in Week 1 next term. Look out for more information later this term.




